2/18/6	PSD locker room 552 Main	While officer was dressing at scene, two suspicious males entered basement premises, claimed they were looking for Rivercross. Officer asked them to leave. The men were still looking around as if "casing" the room. Officer escorted them out, finished dressing, notified Sgt. of incident before Roll Call and gave their description.
2/28/6	near J stairs 546 Main St.	Patrolling officer saw three youths talking in hall on 4 th floor, apprehended one female, searched area for other youths with negative results. Former youth's mother was contacted, responded to PSD, where her daughter had been escorted. A Youth Referral Report was issued to youth, and she was released to her mother.

Perp. was stopped by employees, who removed sandwiches from his pocket. Officer arrived at scene, owner refused to press charges, just wanted perp. banned from entering store.
